Incumbent works as part of the food service team ensuring the children, staff and guests are provided nutritious and appetizing food for breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks. Assists in preparing food in accordance with USDA requirements. Assists in serving food and clean up after each meal. Participates in staff meetings.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Knowledge and ability to prepare food, follow a recipe, measure ingredients and calculate portions to feed up to 160 children and 50 adults.
- Knowledge of USDA nutrition requirements and guidelines for food service.
- Knowledge of traditional native foods.
- Skill in reading, writing and mathematical calculations.
- Skill in planning, organizing, implementing and monitoring all food service tasks for a high quality food service program.
- Skill in preparation and service of nutritional food that children will like and eat.
- Ability to cook food and maintain the nutritional content and ensure it is appetizing in color, texture and appearance.
- Ability to complete food preparation and cooking tasks within a strict time schedule to maintain timely food service.
- Ability to work in a close working environment with others.
- Ability to communicate effectively, tactfully and positively with children and adults.
- Ability to work long hours, sometimes beyond an 8 hour day when necessary.

General Recruiting Indicators:

- Prefer documented successful work experience in institutional cooking and food preparation for large numbers of people.
- Enrolled Yakama preference.

Special Requirements:

- Required to pass a pre-employment drug and alcohol test.
- Required to pass a pre-employment criminal background check.
- Must be mature, stable and prudent in behavior, judgment and decisions.
- Must be drug, alcohol and tobacco free.
- Must be physically capable of doing manual labor.
- Must not have a history of child abuse or neglect.
- Work will require periods of sitting, walking, standing, bending, kneeling and squatting, twisting, turning, reaching, pulling, pushing, lifting and carrying.
- Work requires extensive travel to and from camp as well as any field trips; employee will be required to stay at camp during the week.
- Must have current First Aid/CPR card or be able to obtain one prior to Camp starting.
- Must have current food handler's card or be able to obtain one prior to Camp starting.
- Must possess or have the ability to obtain a valid Washington State Driver's License and the ability to obtain a valid Yakama Tribal Driver's Permit.
