The Fish Technician II is responsible for fish trap operations as part of the Rock Creek Monitoring and Evaluation Project to monitor fish populations on the Rock Creek. General duties include operation and maintenance of adult and juvenile fish traps, collection of biological data, and other field duties.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Knowledge of the Fisheries Resource Management Program.
- Ability to carry out field activities with minimal supervision.
- Ability to work independently and productively as assigned.
- Ability to collect and record field data neatly, thoroughly, and accurately in accordance with established protocols.
- Ability to learn and employ specific terminology and techniques in compiling and recording field data.
- Ability to understand and follow written and oral instructions.
- Ability to read, comprehend, and apply relevant literature dealing with field methods.
- Ability to work outdoors under all types of conditions.
- Ability to perform physical labor such as lifting heavy loads.
- Ability to work in swift river environments and apply safety measures as needed.
- Ability to operate and maintain various types of sensitive equipment.
- Ability to apply basic computer skills (with some instruction) as directed.

General Recruiting Indicators:

- Requires a high school diploma or equivalent AND one-year experience as a Fish Technician I
- OR, a combination of experience and education or training in related field that demonstrates the ability to perform the duties and responsibilities may substitute for required experience.

Special Requirements:

- Required to pass a pre-employment drug and alcohol test.
- Must be physically able to travel on foot and work in remote areas under a wide range of weather conditions.
- Must possess a valid Washington State Driver's License with ability to obtain a Yakama Nation Driver's Permit.
- Enrolled Yakama preference.
