The track coach will utilize knowledge and expertise in running, jumping and field events for Middle and High School athletes. Coach is responsible to design practice sessions, monitor fitness of runners and throwers, and promote team unity. The coach implements knowledge of training methods, stretching, pacing, meet scoring, throwing, jumping techniques, educating athletes, apply good nutrition practices, and implement importance of academic eligibility to participate in sport. Coach will maintain documentation and records of equipment, uniforms, transportation and student participation and awards. Coach will take lead role for the supervision of students/athletes while at practice and at all WIAA sanctioned events.

**Knowledge, Skills and abilities:**

- Knowledge of field and track sport.
- Knowledge of safety regulations, rules and policies that govern the track & field sport.
- Knowledge of equipment needed and used in the sport and how to maintain it.
- Knowledge of physical fitness and training requirements as well as proper and safe diet regime to be used by young athletes.
- Ability to assume responsibility in an educational environment to work with students, families and colleagues.
- Ability to communicate effectively with students, parents/guardians, supervisors and colleagues.
- Ability to prepare curriculum for the sport activity.
- Ability to provide assistance for student to maintain academic eligibility for participation in the sport.

**General Recruiting Indicators:**

- Enrolled Yakama preference.
- Previous positive coaching experience in track and field at the Middle or High School level.

**Special Requirements:**

- Required to pass a pre-employment drug and alcohol test.
- Must have a valid Washington State Driver License with the ability to obtain a Yakama Tribal Drivers Permit.
- Must possess a valid first aid card.
- Must have no history of child abuse or neglect.
- Must have no history of drug or alcohol abuse.
- Ability to complete a background check according to Yakama Nation Tribal School requirements.
