This position will serve as the Education Coordinator for the Environmental Restoration/Waste Management Program (ER/WM). This position will require a team approach requiring a friendly cooperative working relationship with co-workers, other Yakama Nation Programs, and local school officials. The primary function of this position will be to provide Hanford Nuclear Reservation information presentations to our Yakama Nation Tribal Council, Tribal members, High School students, Middle School students, and the general public. The Hanford Nuclear Reservation information presentations will help educate the general public about the US Department of Energy (DOE) cleanup of the harmful release of past and current hazardous chemical waste within the Hanford Reserve site. This position will be representing technical information about the current cleanup and restoration by DOE on the Hanford Nuclear site located within the Yakama Nation's ceded area. Work with Yakama Nation Programs to Coordinate STEM services.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Knowledge of the Yakama Treaty of 1855, Tribal Resolutions, federal and state laws specific to protection of our cultural resources.
- Ability to attend and represent the Yakama Nation ER/WM Program at public forums.
- Ability to work independently and learn about the ER/WM program goals and objectives.
- Must have excellent interpersonal skills, and the ability to work with a wide range of staff and contractors.
- Must have the ability to understand the Treaty rights, history, and culture of the Yakama Nation.
- Must have the ability to break down high-level technical information and present to a non-technical audience.
- Ability to communicate effectively in both verbal and written formats to interact with Tribal members, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Indian Health Services, Department of Energy, Tribal Council elected officials, General Council elected officials.

General Recruiting Indicators:

- Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration, Public Administration, Public Relations, or Earth Sciences and two years of Education and Outreach Experience. -OR- Seven years of professional work experience as an Education and Outreach Specialist.

Special Requirements:

- Required to pass a pre-employment drug and alcohol test.
- Must possess a valid Washington State Driver's License with the ability to obtain a valid Yakama Tribal Driver's Permit.
- Ability to obtain Hanford Reserve Badge.
